The International Congress of the International Academy of Comparative Law, due to be held in Montreal from August 9-14 will be the thirteenth in the series. For the fifth time the Italian Association of Comparative Law has prepared a volume containing Italian reports over most of the topics chosen for discussion at the Congress.

The initiative has now become something of a matter of routine and unwritten rules now govern our involvement. There is thus less and less need for word of introduction and presentation.

As in the past, the volume has been published — with the financial backing of the National Research Council of Italy (C.N.R.) — by Giuffrè and, as on the last four occasions, much of the burden of organising the venture has been shouldered by the Vice-President of the Association, Professor Antonio Gambaro, assisted with increasing zeal by General Secretary, Professor Giannaria Ajani.

As always the team of contributors to the volume includes both seasoned scholars and youngsters keen to shine in the academic world. Their names, already well known in Italy, are destined to become reference points for foreign comparativists interested in Italian law.

As usual, the two general reports, entrusted this year to Professor Rodolfo Sacco and Professor Diego Corapi, are not included in the volume.
